





Once you complete that, and if you've previously registered, the following screen should appear.

MOAA's software wrote three letters for me to Senator Kelly, Senator Sinema and Representative Ciscomani and signed my name to them. To send the letters all I had to do was click on Submit Selected Letters. How easy is that!

I sent a second set of letters to the same three individuals but this time I modified the MOAAwritten letters slightly. It took me a minute or two to change one of the letters and then I copied and pasted the change to the other two letters. I clicked on Submit Selected Letters and I was done. Again, very easy.

MOAA has an excellent legislative advocacy team. With more than 360,000 members, MOAA has clout with U. S. Senators and Representatives to get legislation enacted that benefits activeduty, retired, reserve, all military veterans of all the services and dependents. I encourage you to check out MOAA's Legislative Action Center and to use it to support legislation that will benefit active-duty, retired, reserve, all military veterans of all the services and dependents. Make your voice heard – and MOAA has made it very easy to do that!

The COLA for FY24 has been set at 3.2%. The Defense-State Liaison Office (a DoD agency) has published a list of 10 2024 priorities for military families. This includes Military access to quality family child care; military employment and economic opportunities; defining armed forces in state policy; military community representation on state boards and councils; state support for military families with special education needs; open enrollment flexibility; child abuse identification and reporting; military family anti-discrimination status; state response to military interpersonal violence; concurrent juvenile jurisdiction


